

Rosale Morga Songs of Comfort and Inspiration CD Release, Friday December 17

Tri-State area singer/songwriter Rosalie Morgan will release her new CD, Songs of Comfort and Inspiration, Friday, December 17, just in time for the holiday season. The CD is her fifth release with another planned for release in the spring or summer of 2005.

Morgan, a student of piano from age seven, began writing her own music at age eleven in the back seat of her parent's car. Singing one of her original songs at a local talent show became the catalyst for private voice lessons at age fourteen. Her music education continued at UWC, where she majored in music.

Beginning her professional music career on a part-time basis, Morgan sang at local weddings and funerals, all the time writing and arranging her own original music. In 1996, she decided to pursue a full-time career in music and began by writing and producing radio and television jingles, doing voice-overs and telephone on-hold music for local businesses. To date, she has written over 100 songs.

Her production studio work is balanced by

her live performances at area nightspots like Shultzie's in Dickeyville, The Royal Inn Supper Club in Mineral Point, Rafter's, The Dubuque Golf and Country Club and The Grape Harbor in Dubuque, and The Grape Escape and Benjamin's in Galena. In addition to her own material, she performs songs by such well-known artists as Barry Manilow, Karen Carpenter, Juice Newton, Olivia Newton John, Elton John, Billy Joel, and Sheryl Crow, among others.

Since 1997 Rosalie Morgan has produced four CDs. Two contain all originals – I Won't Say Goodbye and Forever Changed. The two most recent CDs are Christmas albums, recorded by request by those who have heard her live performances, and contain many of Morgan's favorite songs for the holidays.

The new release, Songs of Comfort and Inspiration is a collection of some of her favorite gospel and inspirational songs. Inspired by her moving performances at funerals, many people requested her to record the songs they heard her sing for their loved ones.
